



AGC of Michigan Awarded MIOSHA Safety Grant

Lansing, Mich., Nov. 15, 2023 – In a continuing effort to promote and train on construction safety and health issues, the AGC of Michigan has secured grant funding from MIOSHA to provide an outreach program not only to its members, but to the entire Michigan construction industry. This marks the 35th year that AGC has made safety and health programs available through various grants. Training is performed by AGC safety director Paul Wrzesinski, an AGC staff member and former manager of the MIOSHA Construction Safety Division, along with consultants to address special safety issues.

The program, Safety and Health Support for Construction, will offer contractors:

Statewide training either onsite or at the office in such topics as fall protection, silica, confined space, crane rigging, scaffold safety and electrical hazards; Advanced safety and health sessions will focus on the leading causes of illnesses and injuries; Regional public forums will also be held to provide updates on recent changes to the MIOSHA Construction Safety and Health standards.

The services will be offered statewide and at no cost to contractors. Contractors are encouraged to take advantage of these services, to enable them to improve their safety performance and their bottom line.
